

Train and mentor frontline health providers





Environmental support	Internal and external political environments support FP PAC program, champions, FP common approach, policies
Funding stability and diversification	Consistent financial base for program, sustained funding through a variety of sources
Partnerships/ Relationships	Cultivating connections between program and stakeholders
Organizational capacity (direct link with country programs and new emergencies)	Human resources, concept notes, guidelines and tools, M&E system, logistics and pharmaceutical supply chain system
Program evaluation and adaptation	Continuous assessment of program
Communications	Increasing visibility and perceived importance of FP PAC


- Be born prematurely




