Addressing Gaps in the Evidence for Health and Nutrition in the Humanitarian-Development Nexus

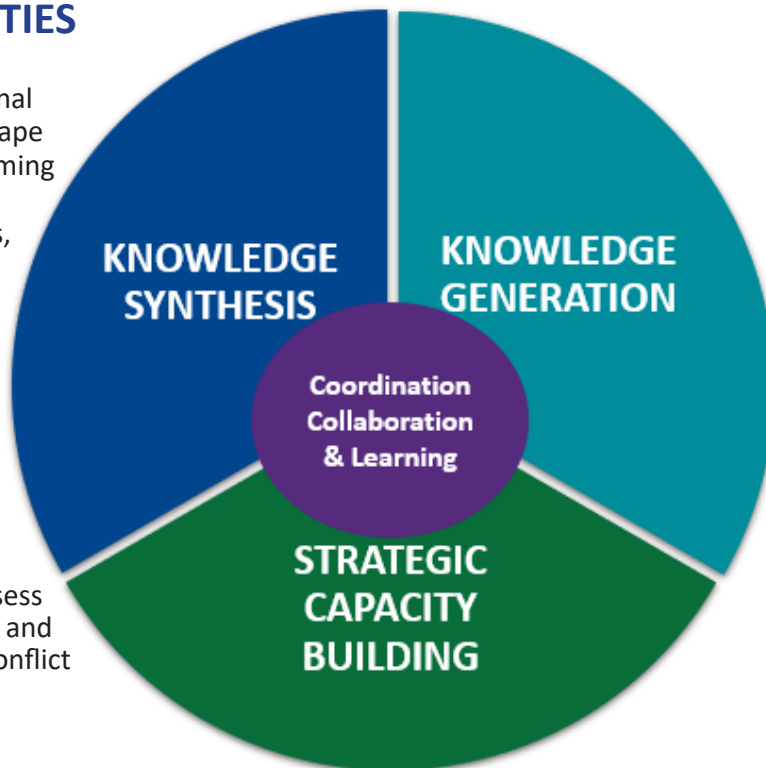
CORE Group has partnered with Save the Children and Medair on a USAID/OFDA-funded initiative to address the operational evidence gaps around health and nutrition in the humanitarian-development nexus, research existing interventions, and turn this research into actionable guidelines.

CORE Group aims to improve the understanding of transition points within dynamic states of protracted conflict, which inherently fluctuate between humanitarian relief and development, and vice versa. Through in-depth research, stakeholder engagement, and strategic collaboration, the Project will engage humanitarian and development actors around the question: ***What tools and guidance exist, work, and/or need to be created to smooth the transition between the humanitarian and development approaches to save, sustain and support life?***

PRIMARY ACTIVITIES

- **CONDUCT** a foundational assessment of the landscape of global health programming across humanitarian and development approaches, including the transition phase

- **PILOT & TEST** these guidelines and recommendations to assess feasibility, effectiveness, and adaptability in various conflict and transition settings



- **PRODUCE** four in-depth case studies of interventions within the relief to development continuum, focusing on health system strengthening and transition matrixes and tools

- **DEVELOP** guidelines and recommendations responsive to the emerging research within the humanitarian-development nexus
