

CGPP Kenya and Somalia
Weekly updates
May 7-11, 2018

1.1 AFP surveillance & case detection

- **Marsabit County:** The Community Mobilizer conducted AFP active case finding at Liban Fayo's cluster and visited 20hh on the 6/5/2018. No AFP case found.
- **Turkana County:** Supported Turkana Central SCMOH in the investigation of a suspected measles case in Lodwar and shipment of the specimen to KEMRI Lab in Nairobi.
- **Garissa County:** AFP active search and support supervision visit to Liboi Health Centre and Daadab Sub-County Hospital, ODK ISS tool used.
- **Lower Juba:** 9 CMs carried out HH visit with AFP case detection messages and managed to reach 1,730 HHs. No AFP case detected. 12 HF's staffs sensitized on AFP Case detection, investigation and follow up by use of standard case definitions.

1.2 Strengthening Routine Immunization

- **Dhobley, Somalia:** Monthly EPI outreach session within Dhobley town 2 HF's and One Mobile clinic, Somalia at IDPs settlement, 187 children vaccinated with no zero dose.
- **Garissa County:** Immunization outreach services to nomadic villages by four health facilities, 132 children immunized.
- **Wajir:** 24 routine immunization outreach sessions conducted at 5 health centers and 2 dispensaries.
- **Wajir:** Synchronization of outreach services done between Gerille Kenya and Gerille Somalia in which measles cases reported on Somalia side

1.3 Cross-Border Coordination

- **Somalia:** During SIA 3 vaccinating teams had been placed at some border villages like Deg elema, Cabdi Sugow, Hamajo and Deg Cadey. These teams were meant to cover population from both sides. At a total of 129 children were vaccinated from Kenya side.

1.4 SIA

- **Nairobi:** SIA May 9-13, 2018
 - ✓ The project supported six CHAs and 201 CHVs to carry out social mobilization for five days during round 0 campaigns. 13,880 households were visited
 - ✓ CRS CGPP supported five teams for three days in bus stops and slums. They reached 4,085 children
 - ✓ The project supported a van to pick vaccinators from vaccine collection point to the field for three days.
 - ✓ The project provided gumboots, umbrellas, torches, microphones for the campaign

- **Somalia (Gedo and Lower Juba)**

- ✓ 14 CMs and 94 CHVs conducted social mobilization in the four districts during the SIA campaigns. An estimated 236,750 persons have been mobilized during the SIA
- ✓ 15 Extra-teams supported in Balad-Hawa, Elwak, & Bardere districts to target both formal and informal crossing points, pastrolist population and IDPs. 1,190 children were vaccinated by the team and no refusals cases reported.
- ✓ A joint supportive supervision/monitoring with the MoH was conducted monitoring 63 vaccination teams.No refusals cases reported and houses well-marked.
- ✓ 3000HHs visited were reached by the team with children being vaccinated in 4 districts
- ✓ Provided 3 extra teams at Dhobley & Deg elema for hard to reach population, vaccinated 482 children of which 129 were from the population from Kenya side

1.5 Social Mobilization

- **Gedo:** An estimated **236,750** persons have been mobilized during the SIA.
- **Garissa:** CMs visited 11 villages for routine AFP case search and has given health education on AFP surveillance and important of immunization, 6,320 individuals were reached.
- **Dhobley, Somalia:**
 - ✓ Sensitized 54 CHVs and 9 CMs for SIA social mobilization starting prior 2 days, all 54 border villages had been reached. Approximate 48,200 people have been reached with SIA messages by the Community based Volunteers along the border villages.
 - ✓ Engaged 3 vehicles mounted with PAS at the major towns of Dhobley, Kulbiyow, and Ras-kamboni to reach many populations with the SIA messages.

1.6 Effective partnerships/Meetings

- **Kenya:**
 - ✓ The Secretariat team participated in the National Immunization Stakeholders forum to advocate for the upcoming SIAs
 - ✓ The Secretariat team participated CDC/MOH meeting for planning a CDC supported 6-month surveillance rapid response project in the Kenya-Somalia border counties
 - ✓ CGPP participated in the National Technical Coordination meeting for the outbreak response at the EOC.
- **Somalia:**
 - ✓ SIA planning and implementation session with key stakeholders among them WHO and MOH to check the implementation of the SIA activities
 - ✓ ARC Polio project Officer worked closely with both DMOH and WHO Regional Polio Eradication Officer to oversee the SIA implementation especially team performance, cold chain and to address any soft refusal within Dhobley town.
 - ✓ Participated Multi-sectoral assessment on the effect of the ongoing flash floods

1.7 Security situation: Security incidents with impacts on aid agencies and CGGP operations;

- Insecurity: Tension due to escalation of AS militia activities in the project sites, i.e. deg elema, ruqa, Abdi sugow, galmagala and elkambere villages are on high alerts due to a recent movements by AS militia. NGOs have restricted movement in the area.

1.8 Other challenges

- **Garissa:** Hamey Dispensary on Kenya-Somalia border is not providing vaccination due to refrigerator explosion and no telephone network coverage in hulugho, sangailu, bothai and galmagala. Also, roads not passable due to rains.
- **Wajir:** Vaccine shortages reported in some facilities due to poor roads after heavy rains reported in some sub-counties.
- **Gedo region, Somalia:** Heavy rains cause poor roads thus delaying teams to reach their target.
- **Lower Juba:** Flash floods are still causing more displacement, especially after the Lagdera plain, had burst its bank leading to flooding to low lying villages along the plain like Diff, Dardar, bula kun, Dhobley Tulo burwaqo, Shabax, Ali buley, magar, DP and Afmadow town.
