

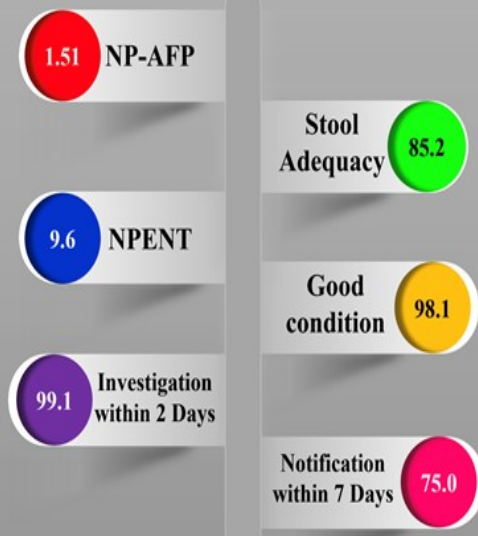


## POLIO UPDATES

### KENYA

- National Non-polio AFP rate and stool adequacy for 2020 are 1.51 and 85% respectively. The Non-polio Enterovirus (NPENT) isolation rate is 9.6%
- One hundred and fifty-six (156) suspected AFP cases have been reported in 2020 from 40 (85%) counties.

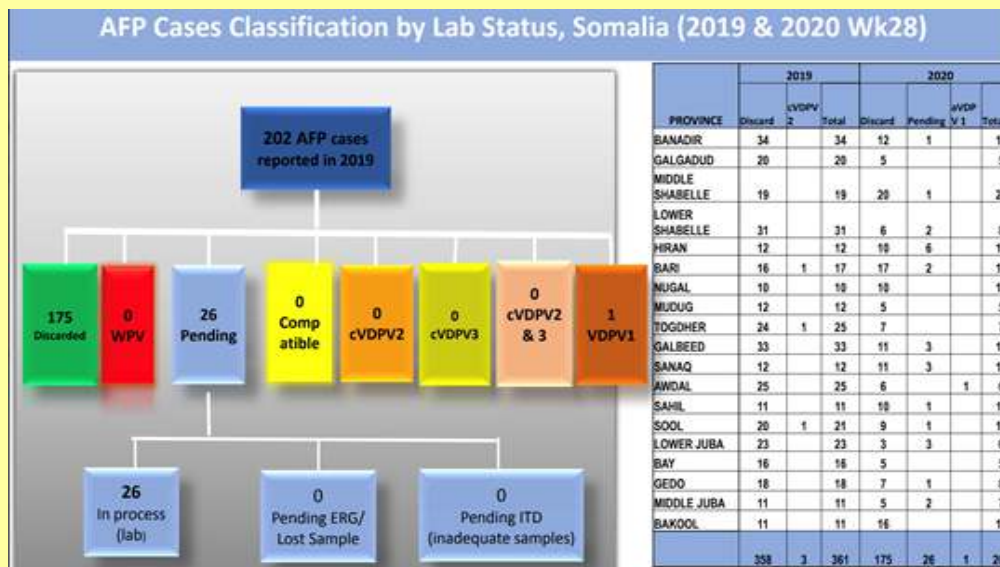
### Performance Summary: Week 28, 2020

### SOMALIA

- A total of 202 AFP cases (92 Females & 110 Males) have been reported in 2020. Of these 176 (87%) have lab result and 26 (15%) cases are in the lab for processing. Of the cases with lab results, five cases had SL isolation, one case positive for cVDPV1 and 1670 cases were negative.
- Of the 350 stool samples from 175 cases with lab results in 2020, 59 (17%) samples have EV isolation.
- A total of 44 ES samples were collected and sent to the lab in 2020. Twenty (20) samples are negative, Two (2) SL, four (4) NPEV and Eleven (11) cVDPV2. Four (4) ES samples are in the lab for processing.

## GHSA UPDATES

### GHSA Key updates

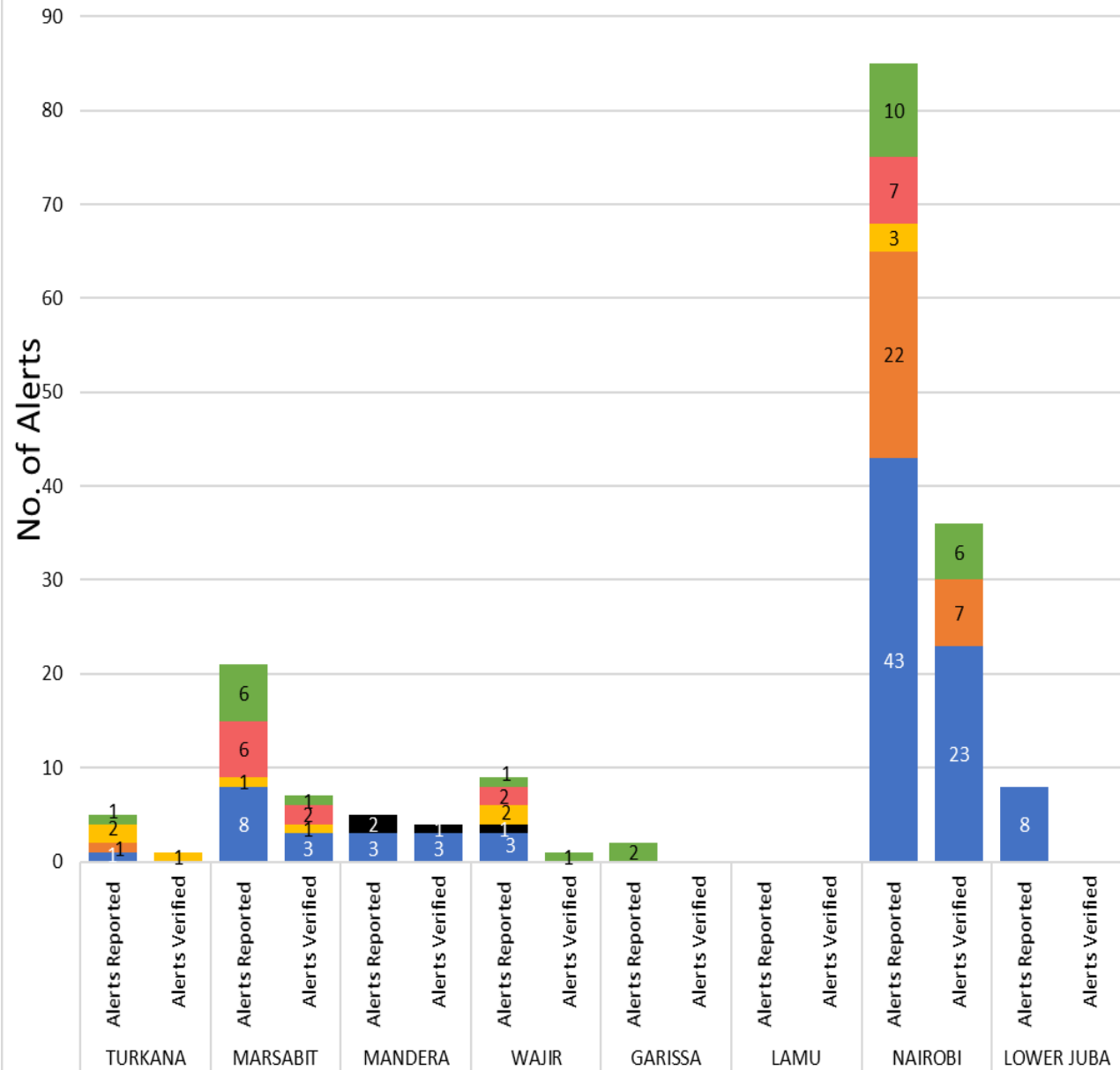
- A total of 17 new animal alerts received this week with 9 Cluster of abortions or deaths of young animals, 4 aggressive animal bite, 3 cluster of animal deaths, and 1 progressive lose of weight
- Cumulatively, over the reporting period (01/04 to 20/07/2020), aggressive animal bites leads with 38 alerts with Turkana County still leading with 23 alerts.
- 12 new human diseases alerts reported this week: 4 acute watery diarrhea cases. 3 cluster of unusual illnesses or death of people and 3 hotness of the body and rash cases and 2 sudden paralysis
- 294 zero reports as well 6 rumor reports received from the community volunteers this week.

**N/B: Zero reports** means community volunteers are active but no alerts picked.

**Rumor reporting** is the hearsay reporting of unconfirmed diseases conditions in the community by community volunteers/community members.

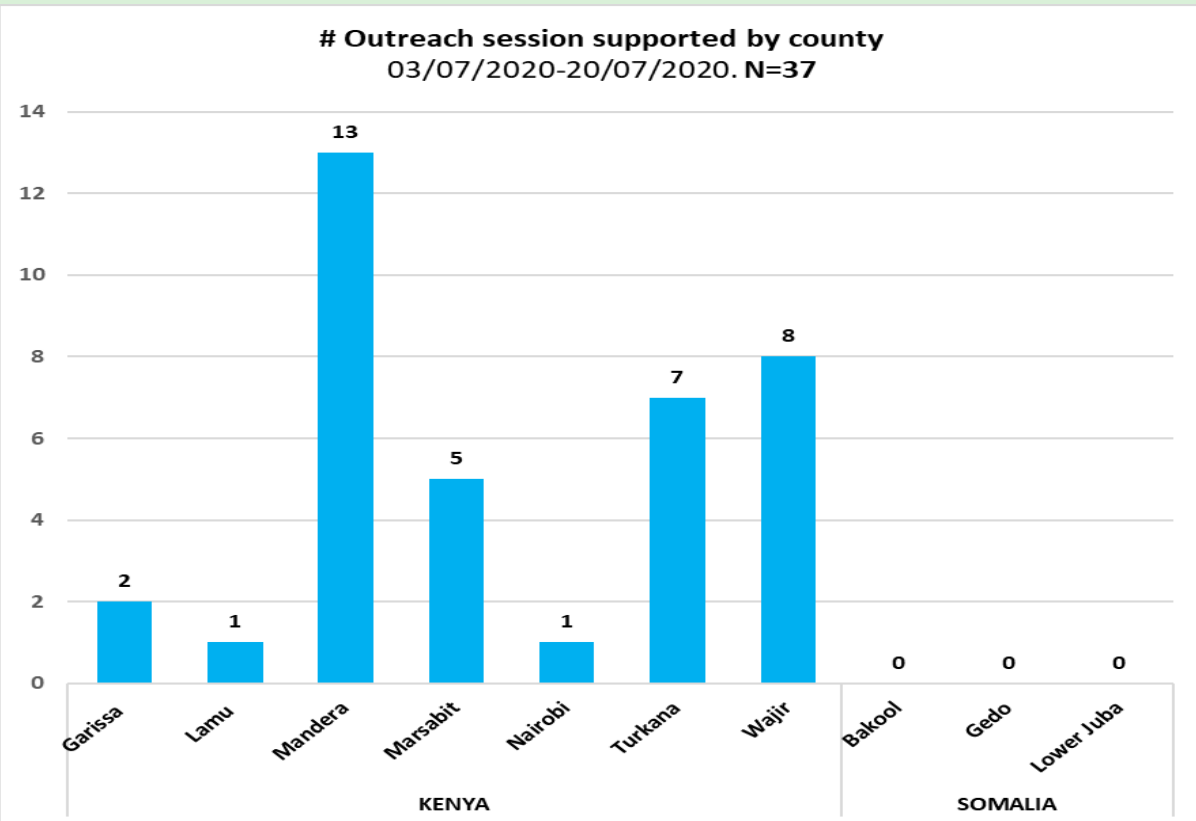

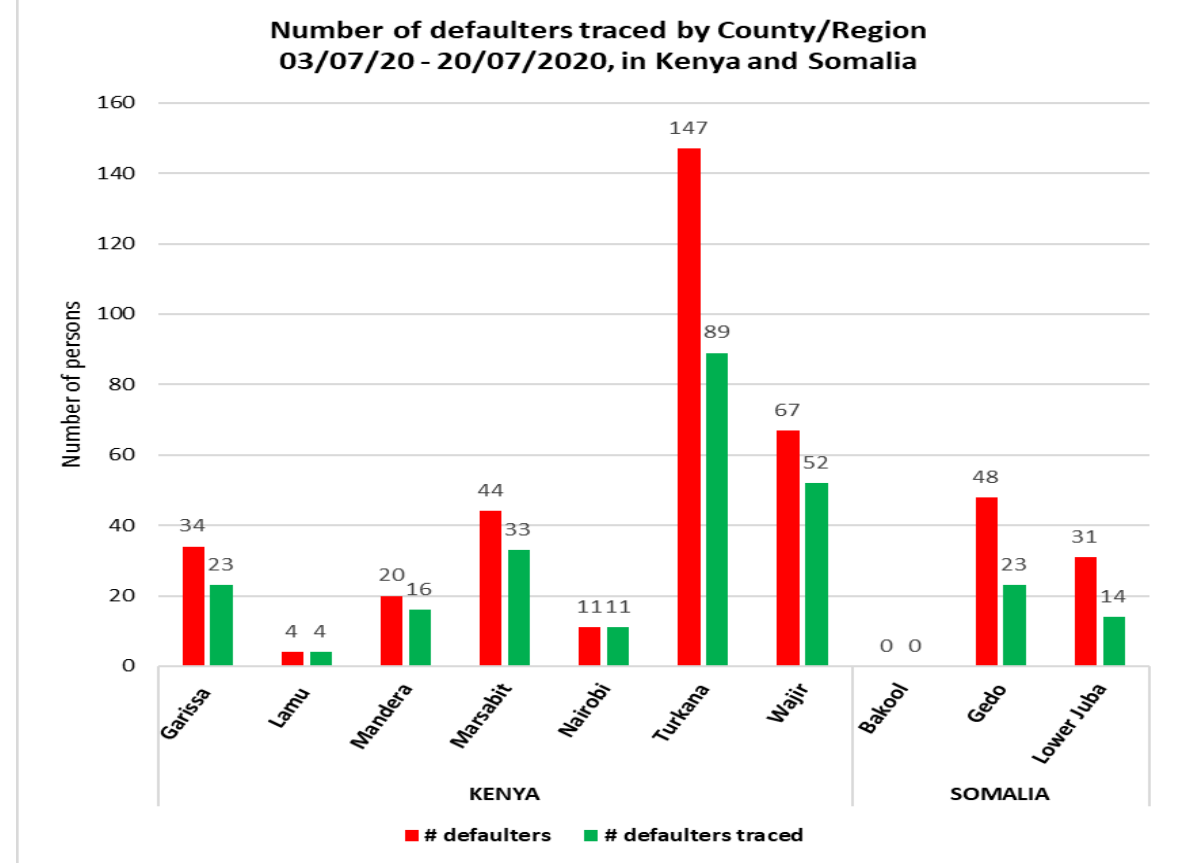

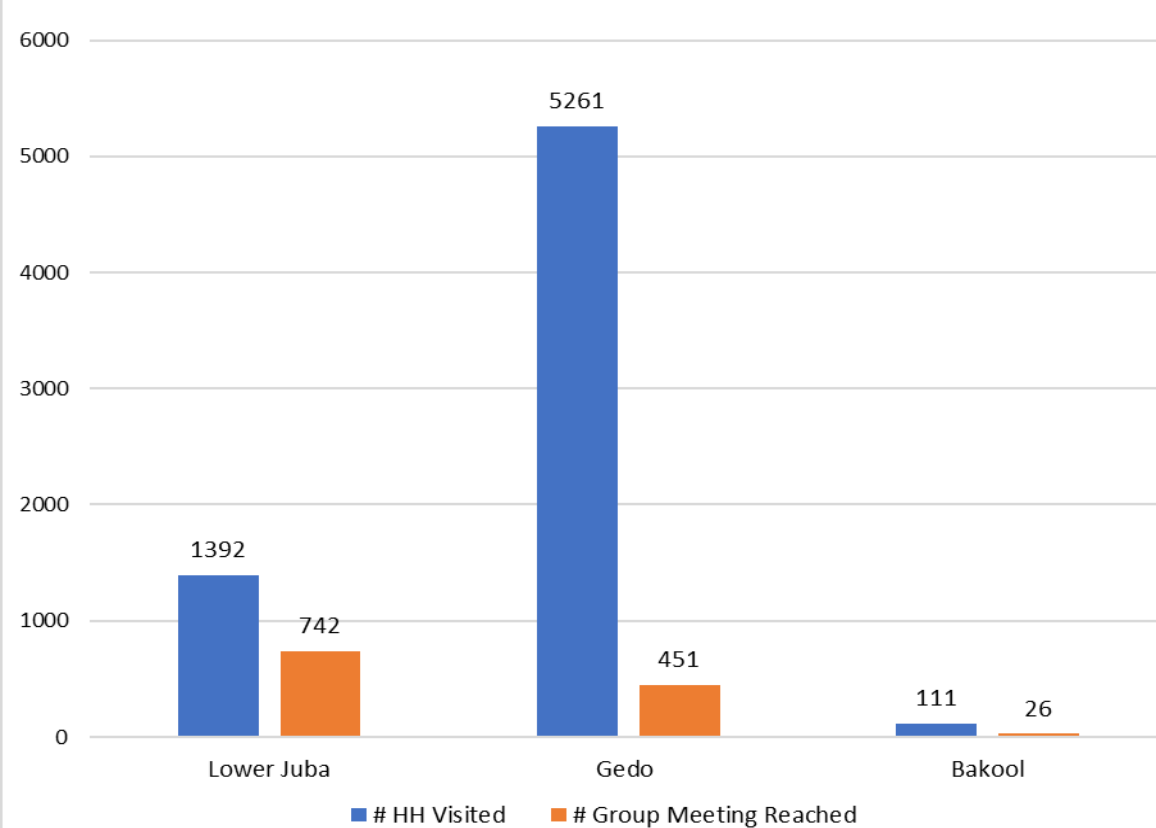

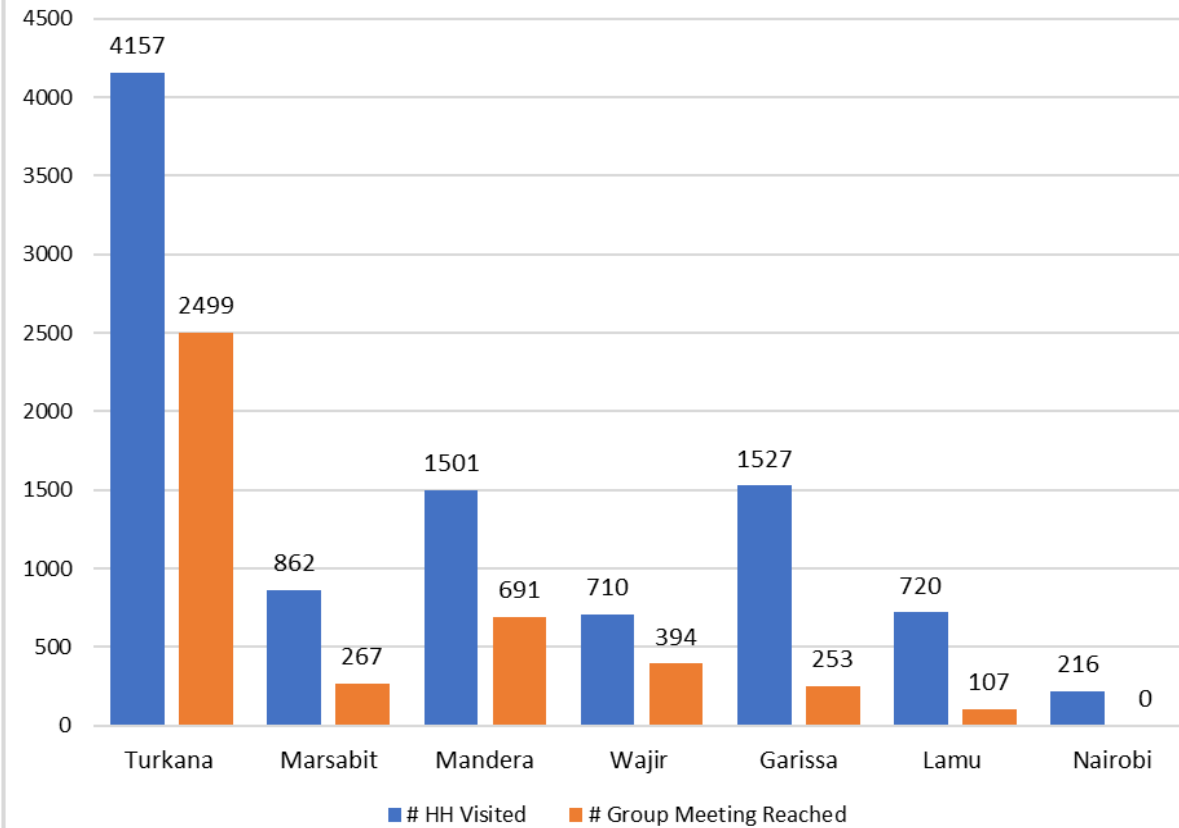

### SOMALIA:

- # of times HH visited in Somalia = 6,764
- # of persons reached through group meetings = 1,219

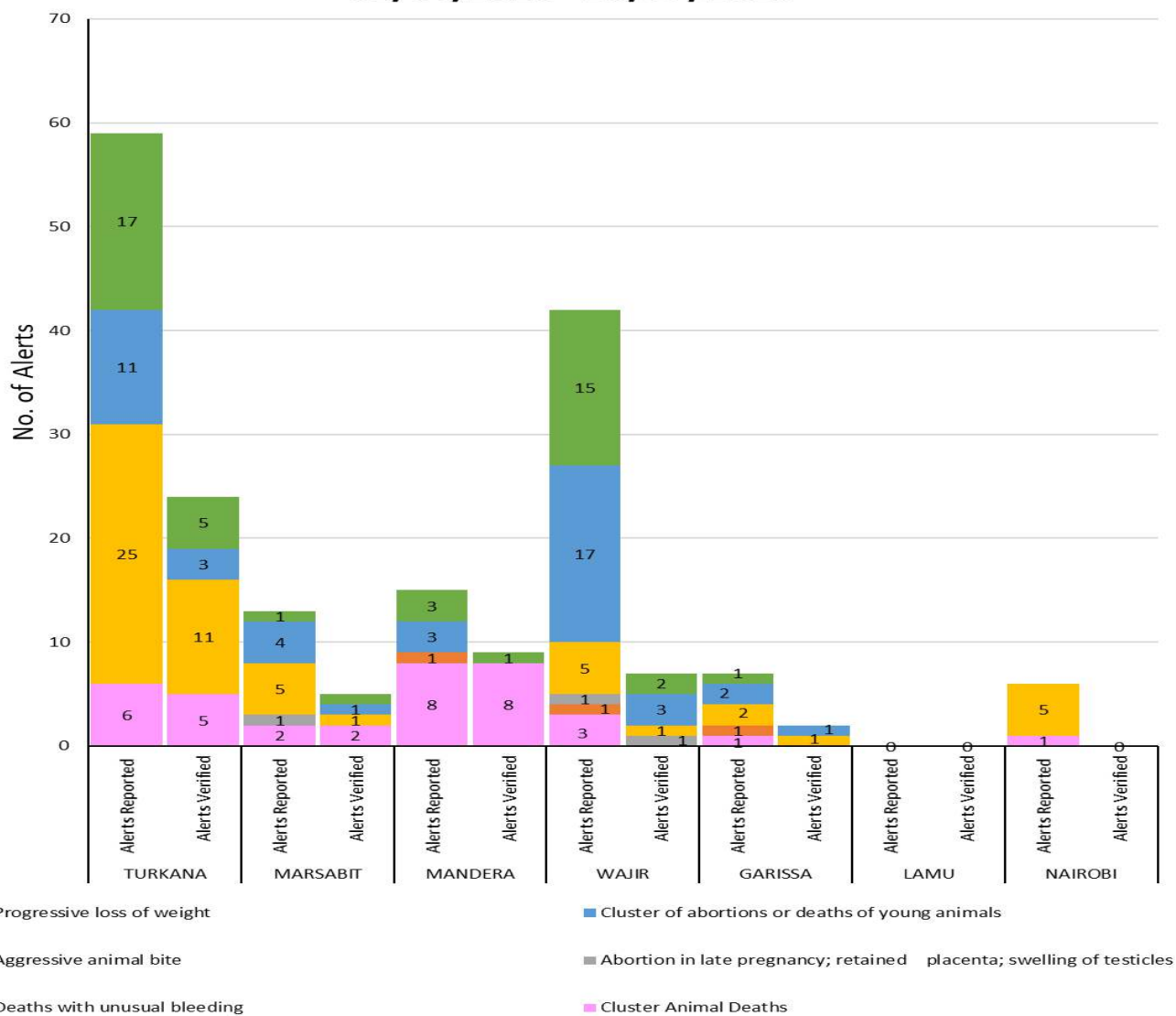
### KENYA:

- # of times HH visited in Somalia = 9,693
- # of persons reached through group meetings = 4,211

- Social mobilizations is to sensitize communities on the importance of personal hygiene, regular handwashing, physical distancing and wearing of masks (especially in this period of COVID-19) in disease prevention at community level. Also community mobilizers & Community Disease Reporters (CMs/CDRs) are looking for suspected AFP & Zoonotic cases using simplified lay case definitions to identify suspected AFP cases and other disease conditions ( e.g. measles, Acute Watery Diarrhoea—AWDs). This is done through one to one meeting at household level or group meeting organized at the community level. The community mobilizers are required to generate reports to the project supervisors and also CHAs or border health facility in-charges.
- The CMs engage in community mobilization for RI services especially during outreach clinic sessions and in RI defaulter tracing.

#### COVID-19 OUTBREAK

A total of **13,353 confirmed** cases with **234 deaths (CFR 1.8%)** since March 2020 with **5,122** case recoveries and majority of cases are local transmission (**93%**).

Female cases: **4,424**

## KEY ACTIVITIES OF THE WEEK

- GHSA Team check-in meeting,. Agenda: Updates on how CBS is going, Updates on the status of Priority Zoonotic Disease risk communication materials Discussion on FY21 work planning.
- USAID Mission & Secretariat GHSA monthly meeting. The meeting reviewed the GHSA quarterly calendar of activities, implementation progress, challenges and lessons learned. Progress on Integration of COVID-19 was also discussed.
- Communities in Marsabit County were provided with information and awareness creation on Rift Valley Fever, AFP (Acute Flaccid Paralysis), COVID-19, and Routine Immunization awareness during 2 different community dialogue sessions.
- Community dialogue also held in Nairobi County to identify the challenges faced for immunization during the COVID-19 pandemic on 16th July with 19 people reached.
- Joint support supervision is ongoing with the presence of Ministry of Health counterparts, Department of Veterinary Services as well as IPs in both Marsabit and Turkana.
- Participate in covid-19 screening and sensitization of the communities on sign and symptoms as well as preventive measures in the project areas.
- Active case search (AFP, other Priority conditions & Zoonotic Priority disease).
- Community Mobilizers/Community Health Volunteers active participation in tracing children who have defaulted in Immunization in the project areas.

## CHALLENGES

- Poor network connectivity in some parts of the project areas affecting smooth communication.
- Kenya Somali border closure by the Government of Kenya affecting movement of people
- Government lockdown in CGPP counties (Nairobi and Mandera).
- Inter clan clashes in Marsabit county affecting planned activities.
- Disruption of planned activities as a result of the Covid-19 pandemic e.g. Care Group Model.
