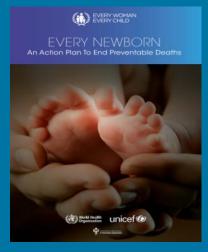

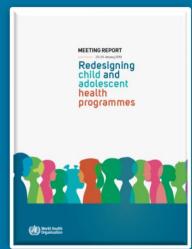

Child health redesign

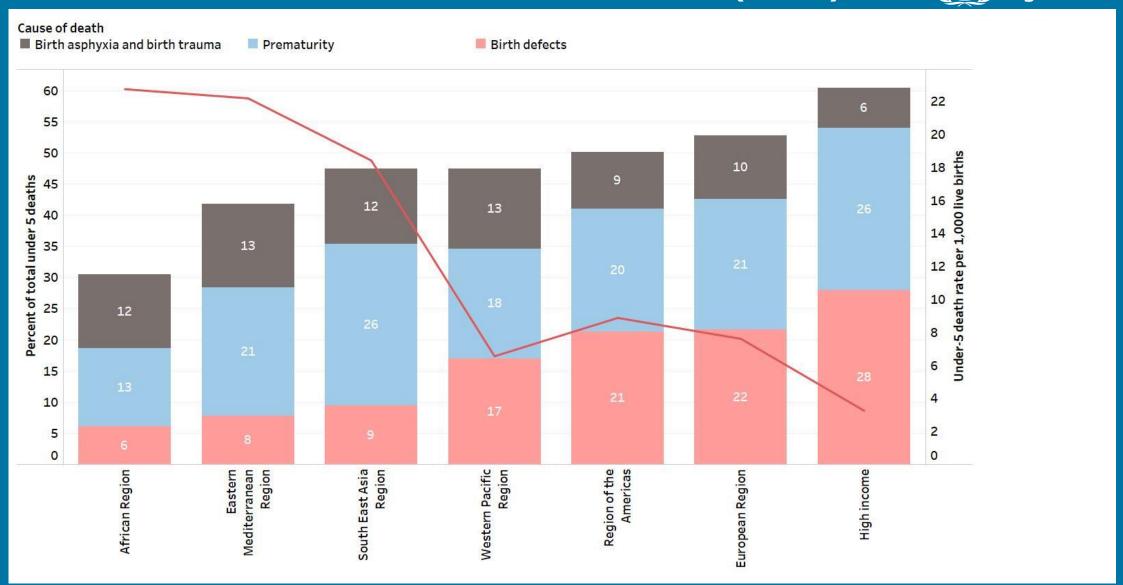








The lower the under 5 mortality rate the higher the proportion of deaths due to birth defects (2016) World Health Organization

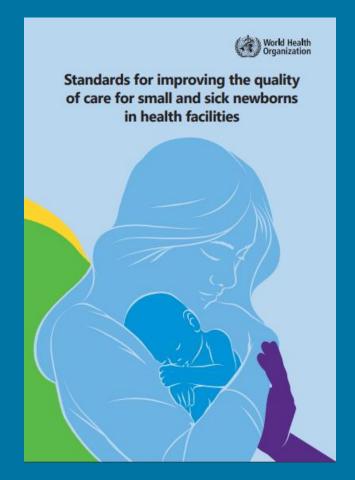


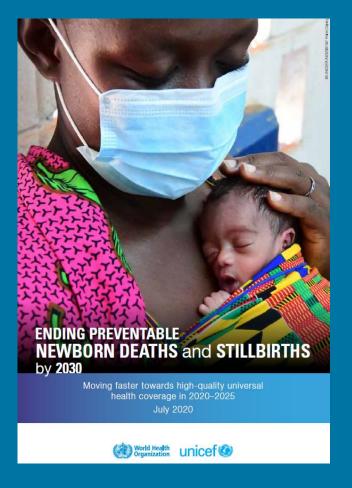

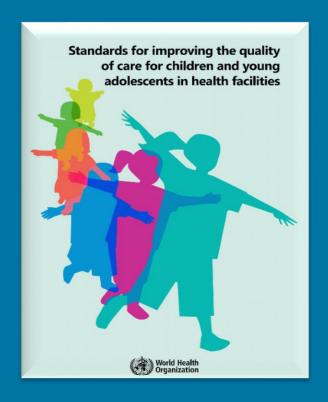

63rd World Health Assembly Resolution on Birth Defects



- The Sixty-third World Health Assembly (2010) passed a resolution promoting primary prevention and improving the health of children with birth defects by:
 - Developing and strengthening registration and surveillance systems
 - Developing expertise and building capacity
 - Strengthening research and studies on etiology, diagnosis and prevention
 - Promoting international cooperation

SURVEILLANCE:

- Birth defect surveillance manual and case definitions
- Capacity building for better surveillance

PREVENTION:

- Global policy for folic acid fortification at country level
- Elimination of Congenital rubella syndrome
- Elimination of Congenital syphilis

CARE

 Identification and management integrated into maternal, newborn and child health programmes

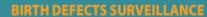

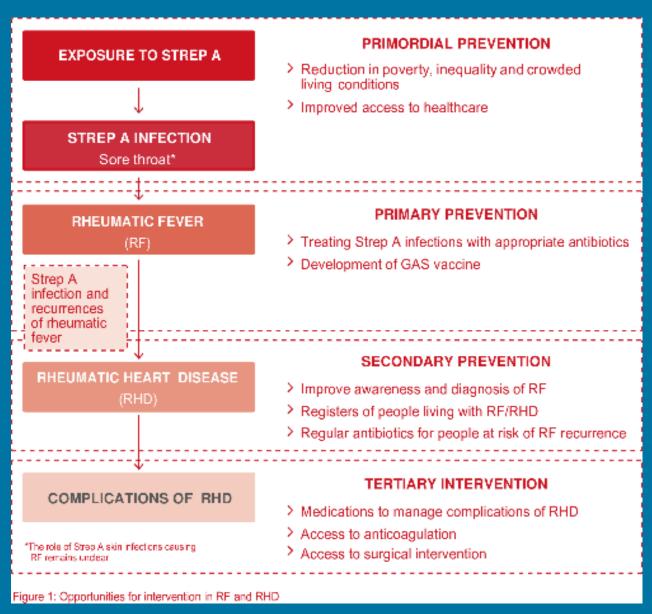
Assess and report on the magnitude and nature of the problem of RHD according to agreed measures, and monitor efforts

 - Monitoring/disease burden
