



CORE Group Polio & Global Health Security, Horn of Africa Weekly Bulletin: FY 22 Q2 Week 3 (17 – 23 Jan 2022)

Cross Border Activities Updates (KENYA)

- **VDPV2 in Mandera Update:** Mandera CORE Group team supported Kotulo sub-county health management team in sample collection from healthy children in Komor Jaldesa, Issack Ibrein and Abdulla balla nomadic settlement in Elram village, Kotulo, Mandera County to ascertain whether there is any ongoing circulation of VDPV2. Some children whose samples collected are siblings to index case and the two contacts identified during initial investigation. The investigation team comprise of Mandera CORE Group project team, WHO and sub-county health management team.
- **Community based surveillance:** No suspected case of AFP or NNT was reported . 2 suspected measles were reported in Mandera by the community mobilizers during the week The Community mobilizers visited 1,967 households .
- **Routine Immunization Outreaches:** The project supported 10 immunization outreach services during the week. A total of 169 children < 1 years vaccinated with various OPV antigens
- **Social Mobilization:** The CVs conducted weekly routine sensitization on immunization & surveillance through house to house strategy while observing COVID-19 protocols. 4,855 households reaching 6,611 (1951 males & 4,660 females)
- **Defaulter tracing:** During the week, border health facilities in Kenya reported 224 children < 1-year defaulters and traced 134 (59%).

Cross Border Activities Updates (SOMALIA)

- **Community based surveillance:** No suspected case of AFP, suspected measles or NNT detected by the community mobilizers during active case search visiting 713 households.
- **Routine Immunization Outreaches:** The project supported 1 routine immunization outreach session with a total of 26 children < 1 year vaccinated with various OPV antigens.
- **Social Mobilization:** The CVs conducted weekly routine sensitization on immunization & surveillance through house to house strategy while observing COVID-19 protocols. 1,236 households visited, reaching 775 (367 males & 408 females)
- **Defaulter tracing:** During the week, border health facilities in Kenya reported 4 children < 1-year defaulters and traced 3 (75%).

Global Health Security—Priority Zoonotic Diseases Updates: (KENYA):

SURVEILLANCE REPORTING:

- During surveillance, the CMs reported a total of 17 animal alerts were reported, one (1) cluster of animal deaths in Mandera, two (2) cases of brucellosis in Mandera and Marsabit, one (1) suspected case of rabies in Garissa and Turkana, two (2) cases of RVF in Garissa and Mandera, Ten (10) cases of suspected trypanosomiasis in Garissa and Marsabit.
- A total of 2 suspected human alerts were reported during the week: two (2) suspected high fever and rash reported in (Mandera).
- A total of 526 zero reports and 5 case of rumor were reported by the community health volunteers.

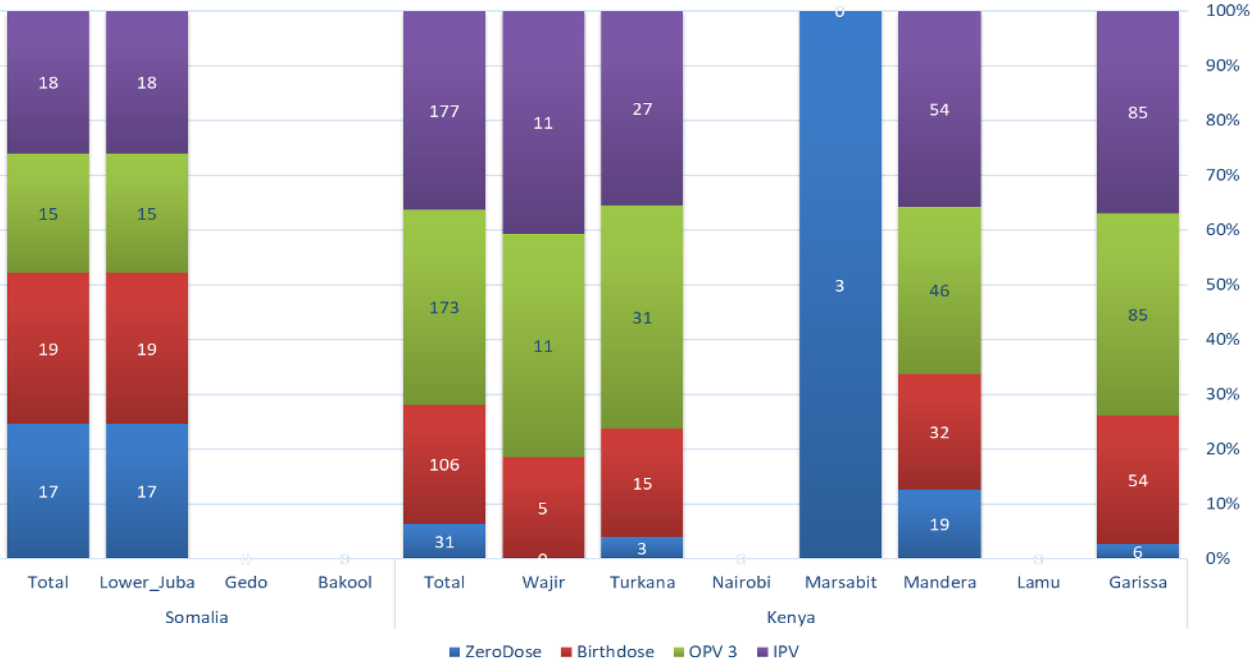

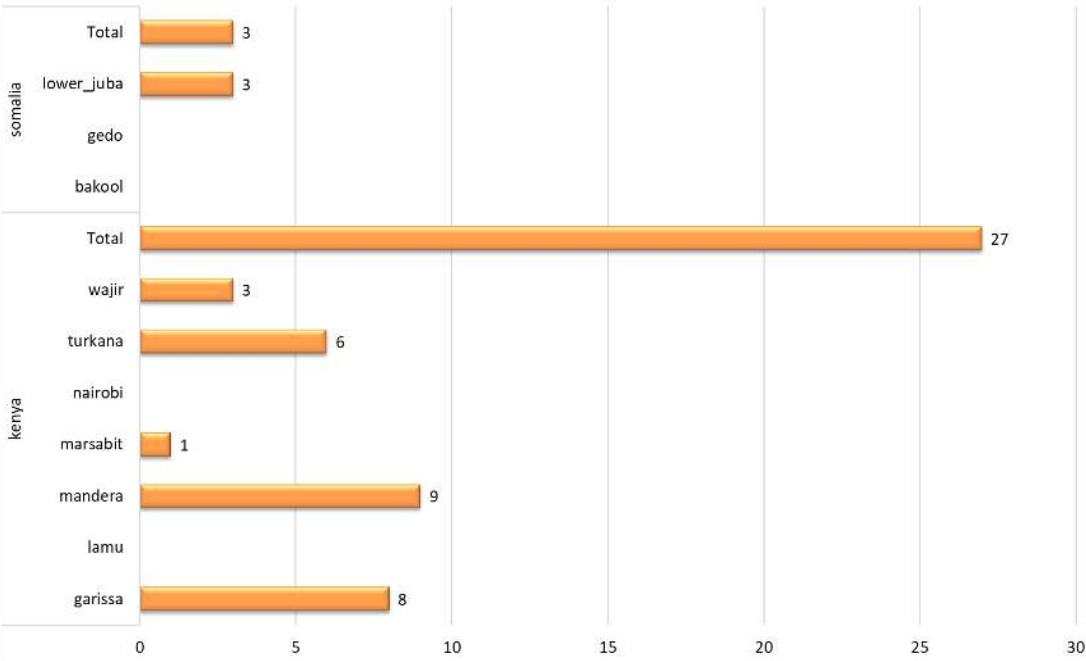

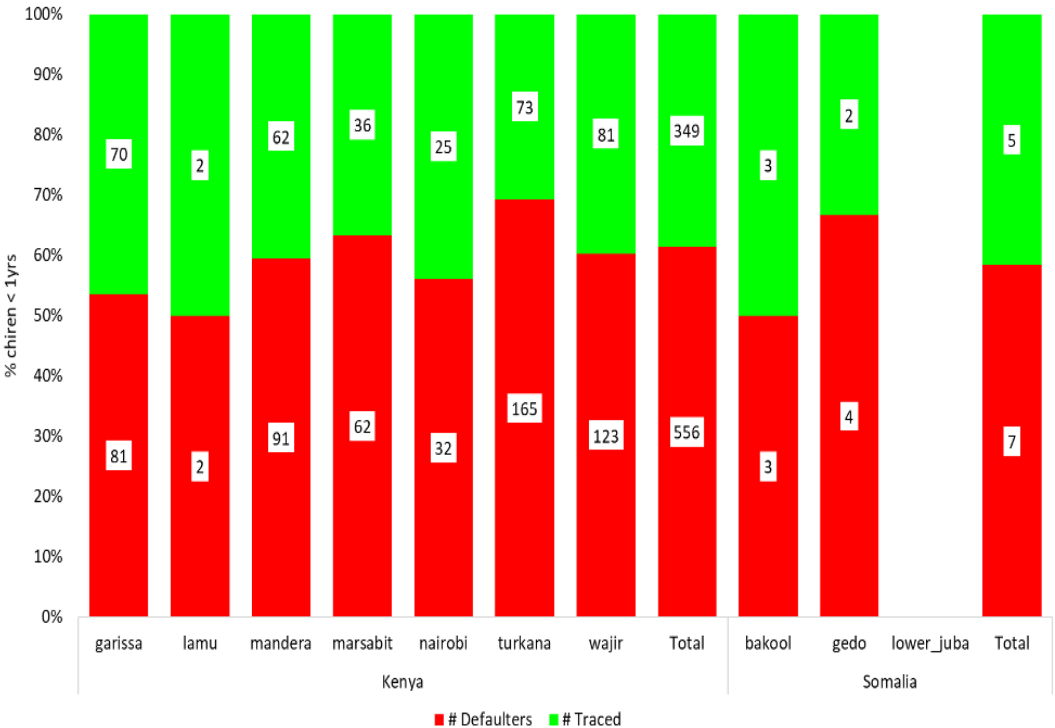
children < 1 years reached with varios OPV vaccines during outreach sessions.

The CGPP project support 97 border health facilities in Kenya and 27 border health facilities in Somalia. The project also supports integrated outreach sessions targeting the nomadic and hard to reach population and other vulnerable populations e.g. minorities/IDPs.

The community mobilizers and community volunteers conduct social mobilization in the outreach sites for maximum utilization of the services including sensitization on vaccine preventable diseases.

Active case search for AFP is also integrated during social mobilization/ community sensitizations. A reward of KES 1000 (\$10) is given to any community mobilizer/community informants who reports a suspected AFP case that meets the lay case definition. The project supports a maximum of 12 cases per County/region.

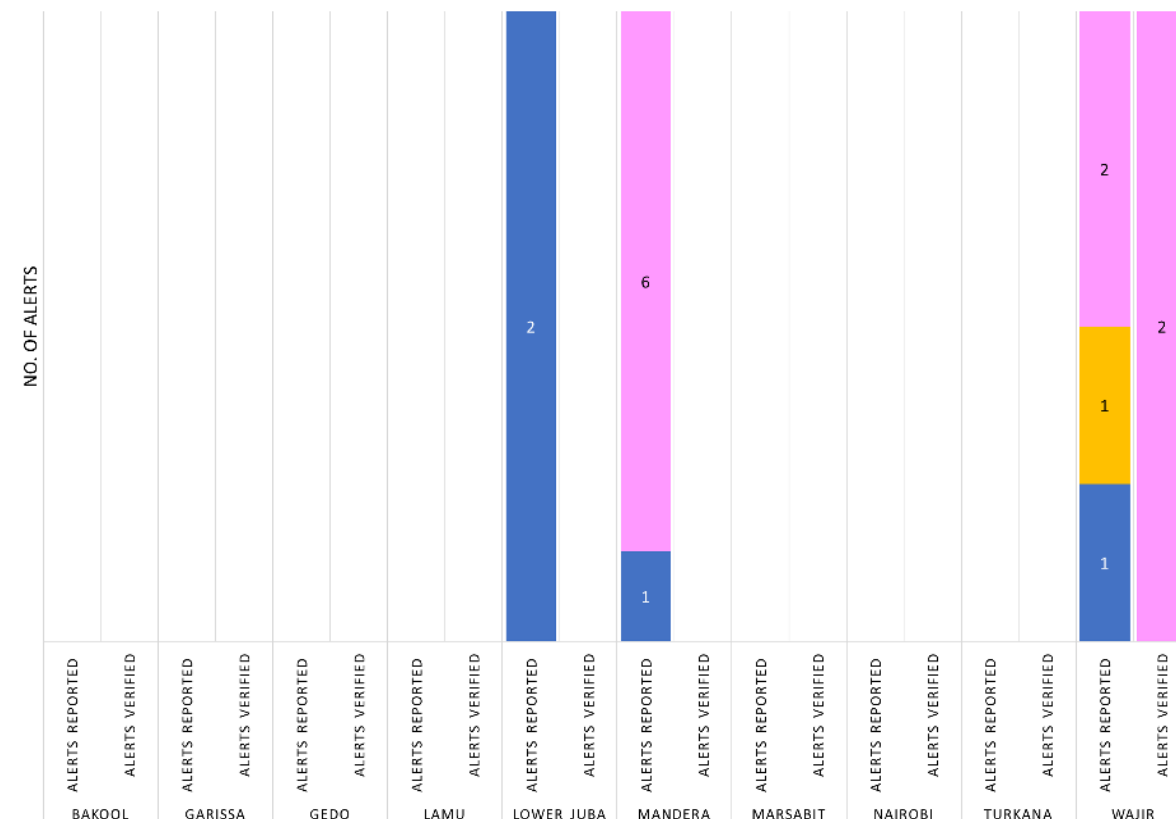
COMMUNITY BASED DISEASE SURVEILLANCE ON HUMAN ALERTS/ACTIVE CASE SEARCH

01/01/2022 - 23/01/2022



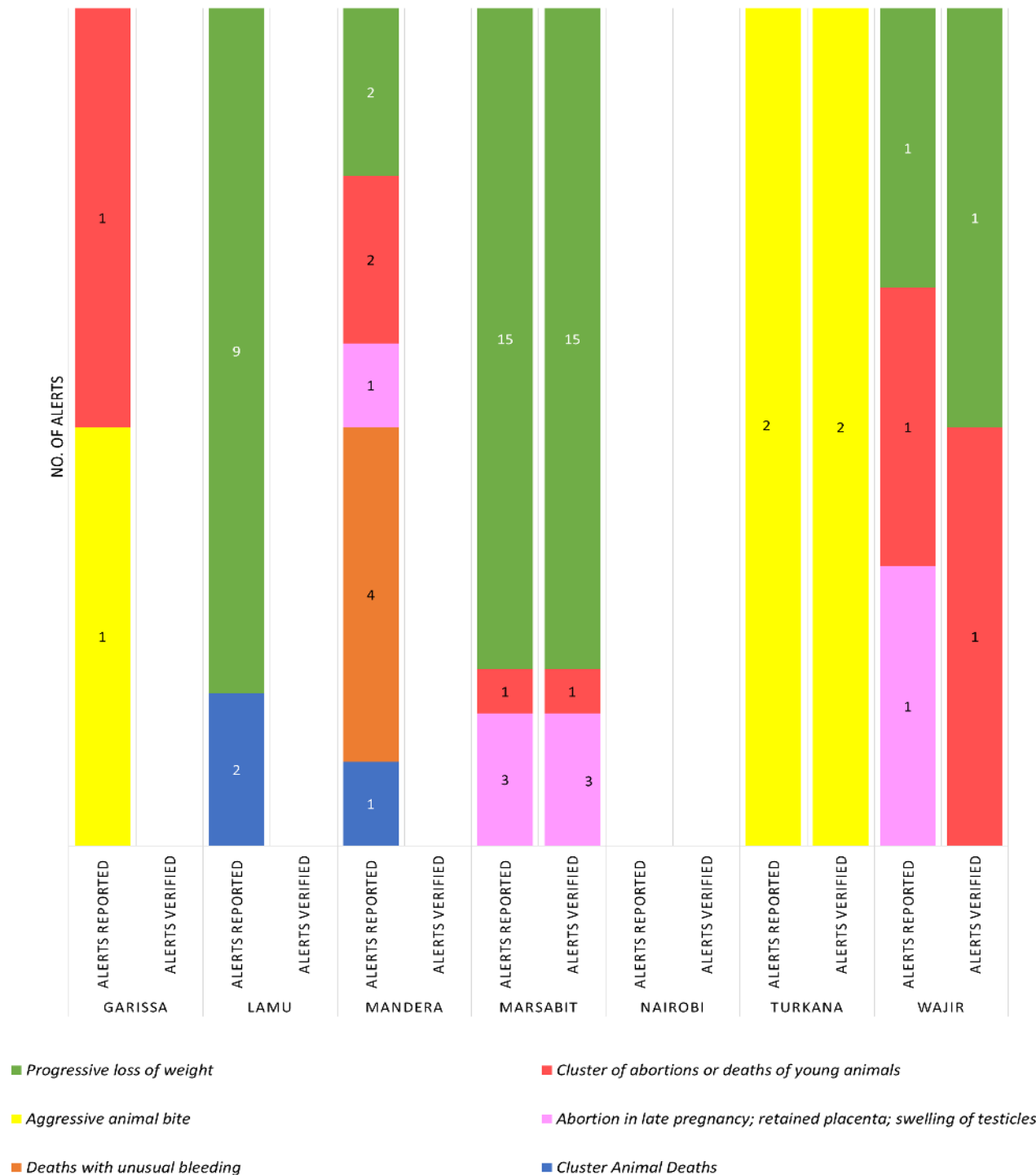

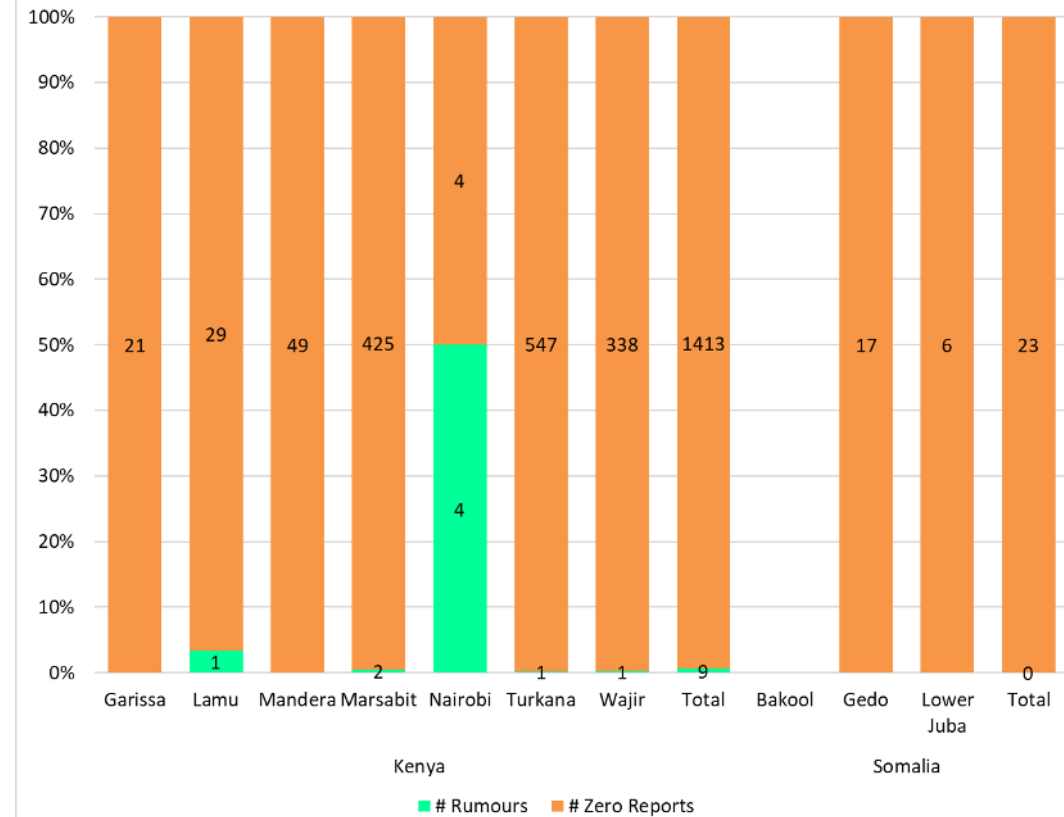

01/01/2022 - 23/01/2022



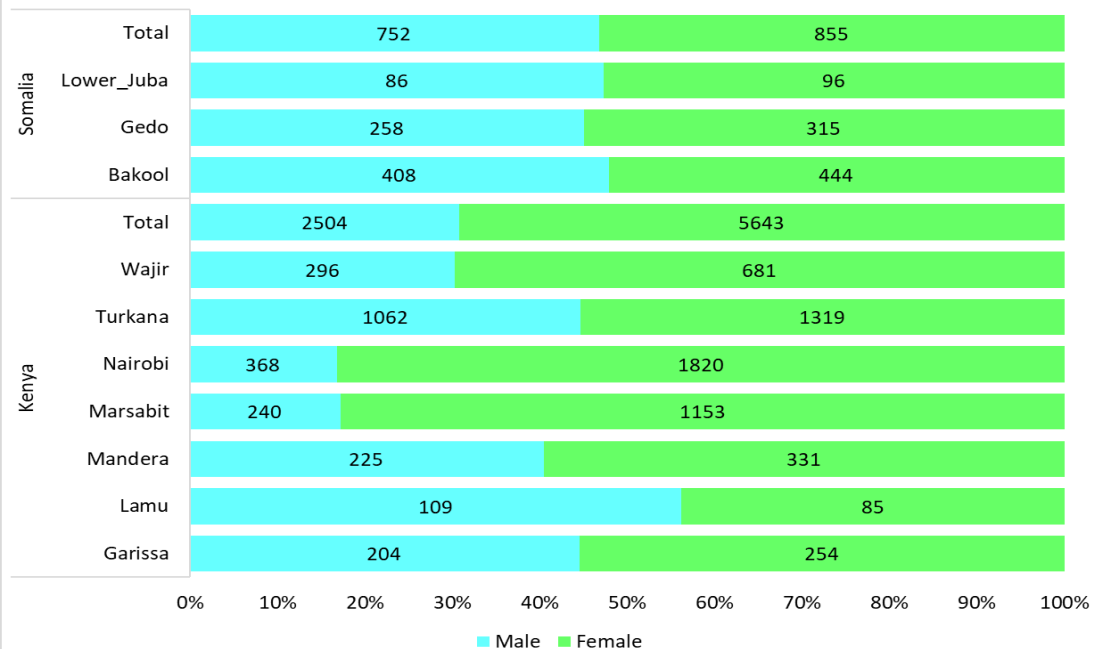
Rumours and Zero reporting (01/01/22 – 23/01/2022)



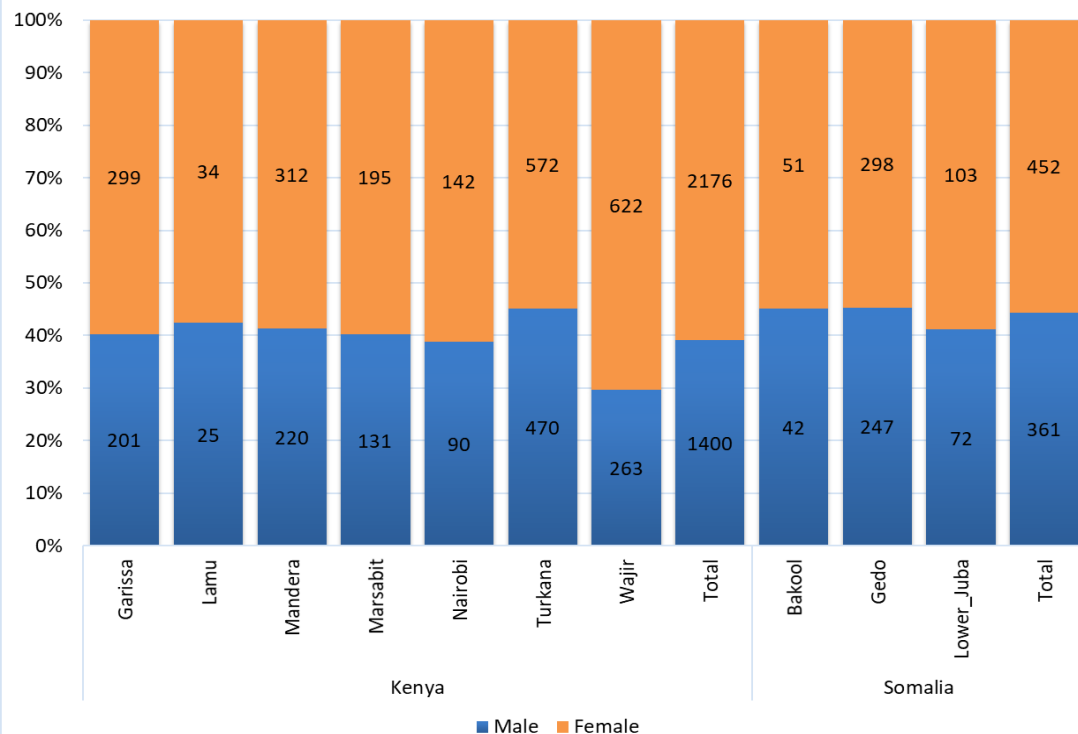
- **Rumor report** – this are hearsay information on diseases or disease intelligence reports collected by the community mobilizers
- Example: “ *There is a report from a kraal leader called Eregae Ekal who told me that, their is a lot of diarrhea cases in Kalokok in Turkana county. More than 5 people have reported cases in the village.*” Turkana, Nairobi
- **Zero reports** - are reports showing the community volunteers are doing active case search but no alerts picked during active case search.

SOCIAL MOBILIZATION ACTIVITIES

- **1,809** HHs visited by the social mobilizers for sensitization of community members on hygiene, routine immunization, nutrition, priority zoonotic diseases and COVID-19 including vaccinations during the week.
- Social mobilizers also managed to visits a total of **1,152** under five years children during the week (Kenya—996 and Somalia—156), to check their routine immunization status, defaulters and schedules.
- **29** group meeting were conducted during the week reaching a total of 1,539 community members with 71% females (1,086) and 29% males (453)
- **42** influential people were sensitized through community dialogue and sensitizations meeting
- 7 religious leaders, 10 traditional healers, 15 village elders, 2 women group leaders and 5 chief/sub-chiefs were reached by CMs amplifying the messages of routine immunization, vaccine preventable diseases and priority zoonotic diseases.
- **3** school heads and madrasa leader took part in the dialogue sessions and were also encouraged to amplify health messages especially routine immunization.

- Due to the biting drought experienced in the project areas , there's massive death of live-stock, high livestock movements, high defaulter rates since the nomads migrated to Somalia in search of pasture and water.
- Competing priority e.g., Covi-19 related activities
- High influx of displaced person both Dollow and Luuq District due to severe drought.
- Poor internet connectivity in Badhaadhe district, Gedo, Somalia that is affecting reporting.
